A Regular meeting of the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board was held in the boardroom of the Administration Centre, 235 Montée Lesage, Rosemere, QC on Wednesday, April 27, 2016 at 19:30 hours, at which were present:

There were no questions.

4.0 REPORTS FROM THE CHAIR & DG

4.1 *Chair Report:*

The Chair presented her monthly report noting:

- the naming of Sébastien Proulx as the new Ministre de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur ;
- the Quebec English School Boards Association (QESBA) presentation at the Bill 86 public hearings was a very successful initiative;
- Bill 86 has aligned the English and French school boards and work was done to create a collaborative brief on this Bill for presentation to the Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur (MEES);
- a presentation made to the Laval Junior Academy Student Council;
- there were 1,200 submissions from the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board for the Laval-Laurentides-Lanaudière Families Young Authors Celebration and many of these submissions were honoured;
- Impact Game Day for the school board was well attended with 1,400 tickets sold to the school community. Students from Laval Senior Academy and Rosemere High School received bursaries from the soccer club;
- attendance at meetings, school and community events.

4.2 *Interim Director General's Report:*

The Interim Director General presented his monthly report highlighting:

- the Grenville Elementary School "Healing Harp & Restorative Drumming" pilot project which addresses anxiety and stress in students through drumming in groups of 4-6 students, one-on-one harp classes and Thai Chi for all students. This pilot project will be featured in the Canadian Association of Principals spring magazine;
- the Sanofi Biogenius Competition, Québec Regional Edition, where Thomas Ribeiro, a student at Laval Senior Academy, won first prize for his Super Plant project. He will participate in the Canadian portion of the competition in Ottawa from May 2-3, 2016 and if he wins at that competition he will go to San Francisco in June for the international competition;
- if the Ville de Laval wins its candidacy to host the Jeux du Québec in the summer of 2020, Laval Junior Academy will be used to house athletes;
- the collection of prescription eyeglasses at Terry Fox Elementary School for the Canadian Lions Prescription Eyeglass Recycling Centre (CLERC);
- the training of a service dog at Laval Junior Academy for 4 months after which the dog will be placed with someone who has ASD or PTSD;
- the Rainbow Room at Crestview Elementary School was featured in the Montreal Gazette during the month of March.

Parent Commissioner Angela Martorana advised that twenty-four (24) students from Laval Senior Academy participated in the Hydro-Québec Regional Science & Technology Fair and three (3) won top prizes and will be moving on to an engineering fair in Phoenix, Arizona in May.

5.0 BUSINESS ARISING

5.1 *Sale of Building – 171 Mary, Lachute:*

The Director of Material Resources advised the Council that it will take the MEES between 4 to 6 months to analyze and approve this sale.

WHEREAS the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board approved resolution #CC-150629-CA-0202 authorizing the Director of Material Resources to begin the process with the Société québécoise des infrastructures (SQI) for the sale of the building located at 171 Mary Street in Lachute;

WHEREAS the Director of Material Resources followed the required process for the alienation of a public entity building;

WHEREAS no direct interest was expressed by the public bodies to whom a letter of intention to purchase the building located at 171 Mary Street in Lachute was sent to;

WHEREAS the real estate market in Lachute is challenging;

WHEREAS the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board received an initial offer of 430,000\$ to purchase from the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil;

WHEREAS the Director of Material Resources re-negotiated the offer with the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil for a new offer of 475,000\$;

WHEREAS the Corporate Committee mandated the Director of Material Resources to make a counter offer of 500,000\$ to the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil;

WHEREAS the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil has accepted the counter offer of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board;

WHEREAS the monetary value of the offer is deemed acceptable and fulfills the Société québécoise des infrastructures (SQI) requirements;

Commissioner Robert Dixon MOVED THAT, on the recommendation of the Director of Material Resources, the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board authorize the Director of Material Resources to present the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil's offer to purchase the building located at 171 Mary Street in Lachute, in the amount of 500,000.00\$, to Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur for analysis and approval.

5.2 *Composition of SEAC - Modification:*

The Chair advised the Commissioners that the Corporate Committee has requested that Complementary Services draft a list of representatives of the bodies which provide services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities, from which to select potential members of the Advisory Committee on services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities.

The Secretary General noted the following resolution is to modify the number of Principals that are part of the Advisory Committee on services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities in order to reflect the law.

WHEREAS the current composition of the Advisory Committee on services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities includes "2 school principals as designated by the Director General";

WHEREAS section 185 of the Education Act (R.S.Q., Chapter I-13.3) stipulates that the composition of the Advisory Committee on services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities is to have one school principal;

Parent Commissioner Pamala Cripton MOVED THAT the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board modify the composition of the Advisory Committee on services for handicapped students and students with social maladjustments or learning disabilities to read "1 school principal as designated by the Director General".

5.4 Multi Service Centre:

The Director of Financial Resources made a Power Point presentation on the funding mechanism for the Multi Service Centre partnership with Commission scolaire de la Seigneurie-des-Milles-Iles (CSSMI) noting:

- for programs sanctioned in English, the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board (SWLSB) will declare and receive all funding for the ETPs;
- interest and depreciation will be deducted from the ETP funding received from the MEES;
- any residual funding will be transferred to the central operation budget of the Multi Service Centre;
- the financial impact:
 - the partnership agreement is designed so that there is limited impact on the annual operating budget of this school board;
 - all surpluses will be equally shared;
 - all deficits will remain with the Multi Service Centre and the CSSMI and any recovery plan will be managed and will impact the Multi Service Centre only;
 - this school board must maintain a minimum number of students in order to obtain enough funding to cover debt service costs;

- the estimated annual interest (\$120,000) and depreciation (\$65,000) on the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board Multi Service Centre loan is \$185,000;
- the financial breakeven point of this school board is 15 ETPs;
- the total long term debt assumed by the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board is \$8,057,929 and includes:
 - the new loan for the Multi Service Centre;
 - the loan for the Administration Centre
 - the loan for Ste-Agathe Academy Enlargement Project; and
 - the loan for Phase I & II of the Energy Projects.

In response to questions from Commissioner Robert Dixon, the Director of Financial Resources, with the assistance of the Directorate team, noted:

- if 15 ETPs are not achieved the monies will have to come from the school board's operating budget;
- the Carpentry Program accounts for a least 3 cohorts annually or approximately 20 ETPs, so this will provide the funds required for the Multi Service Centre. There will also be other programs with ETPs that will contribute;
- registration will remain with the CSSMI but discussions are taking place to ensure that any requests for programs in English are directed to the SWLSB;
- discussions are taking place at the Comité de suivi and with the Directors General of both school boards concerning issues that are not part of the partnership agreement;
- working on rebuilding trust and communications;
- the Comité de suivi meets on a regular basis to ensure that the concerns of both parties are being addressed as quickly and efficiently as possible;
- at this point in time the impact on the cohorts is more positive than negative given that there are more opportunities for students. Once the centre opens a true impact assessment will be possible.

In response to a concern expressed by the Vice-Chair, the Chair indicated that the school community must be informed of the benefit for all students of this investment and that it is largely self-financing and will not affect services to students in the youth sector.

Commissioner Robert Dixon proposed that the proposed resolution concerning the Multi Service Centre be tabled until some guarantees are made concerning the English Vocational Training students. Commissioner Gagnon did not accept this proposal.

6.4 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

6.4.1 Purchase of Interactive White Boards:

- to date the school board has purchased approximately 710 whiteboards;

- since the whiteboard project began the supplier has been the same, although there are a few whiteboards of a different brand for which different supplies are required. The laptops that are used with the whiteboards are from various manufacturers;
- the school board has more whiteboards than subsidized by MEES given the donations from the Sir Wilfrid Laurier Foundation and private donations;
- there is no school without a whiteboard.

The purpose of the letter is to ensure the MEES that the school board is aware of its deficit and that it is taking the necessary steps to resolve the situation.

WHEREAS the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board wishes to offer “Production acéricole”, “Installation et entretien de systèmes de sécurité” and “High-Pressure Welding” in English;

7.3 Parent Commissioners Report:

In response to a question from Parent Commissioner Martorana, the Interim Assistant Director General noted:

- the GPS initiative for Morin Heights Elementary School transportation was delayed but is now underway;
- the feedback received to date on the GPS initiative from Grenville and Morin Heights Elementary Schools is that it is being used quite frequently by the parents;
- all parents of the two pilot schools have access to GPS reports as to the location of their child(ren)'s bus at any point along the route;
- if there are questions or concerns about the GPS initiative the parents have a direct contact within School Organization & Transportation.

Parent Commissioner Pamala Crompton provided an update on last evening's meeting of SEAC noting that some concern was expressed over the number of parents with special needs children choosing to send their child to another school board or private school when they reach high school because they feel that this school board does not have the tools to assist their child at that level. SEAC would like the school board to look into this.

She went on to note that last evening she resigned as Chair of SEAC as her son will be graduating in June 2017 and she wanted to allow someone else the opportunity to lead SEAC.

The Chair thanked Ms. Cripton for all of her dedication to SEAC over the years.
